The 2nd interview will be held in person at the Thunder Bay office and may include a one hour written test based upon the Ontario Water and Wastewater Certification Office “Need to Knows” for the job description.

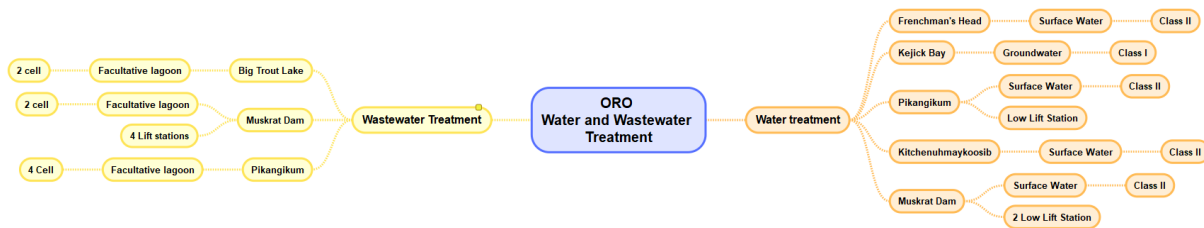
### Position/Company Summary:

The First Nation Chiefs Council provides policy and direction to the IFNA organization, in the areas of Education, Economic Development, Technical Services, Financial Management, and Governance.

The IFNA water and Wastewater Treatment ORO reports to the manager of the IFNA water and wastewater hub.

### Roles and Responsibilities:

The Independent First Nations Alliance (IFNA) Water and Wastewater Treatment ORO provides the following support to the FN water and wastewater operators:

- Provide hands-on support to the operators in meeting the quality standards for water and wastewater as stipulated in the relevant codes and regulations,
- Assist operators in the administration of operations and maintenance work,
- Assist operators with the procedures required to conduct sampling and testing,
- Mentor operators in all aspects of administration,
- Provide comments on feasibility studies and design proposals,
- Participate in the commissioning process for new water, wastewater and fuels systems,
- Work with operators to develop and implement individualized operation and maintenance training plans,
- Guide operators through the licensing process,
- Help operators to identify and correct occupational health and safety problems,
- Mentor the operators on how to apply emergency procedures,
- Participate in the 24/7 technical support hotline,
- Prepare and submit site visit reports to the hub manager.
