Job #300 Public Health Nurse

Location: IFNA Communities (in person)

Department: Health Services

Type of Role: Part-Time

Are you passionate about providing in-depth nursing knowledge, skills, clinical expertise and advance judgment through consultation, clinical practice, leadership and knowledge transfer through health promotion, and disease prevention? This role acts as a link between the community-based workers and nurses, physicians, and professional visitation with a focus on community wellbeing. This position delivers in-person care in remote Independent First Nations Alliance communities and uses virtual platforms to provide remote services.

Responsibilities:

- Develop and implement culturally relevant health promotion programs for Indigenous populations.
- Conduct community health education on nutrition, chronic disease, mental wellness, and reproductive health.
- Assess and address health literacy to ensure clear, accessible, and culturally appropriate information.
- Advocate for policies supporting healthy environments and equitable healthcare access.
- Coordinate needs assessments and planning for COVID-19 and other infectious diseases.
- Lead immunization campaigns, health screenings, and infectious disease surveillance.
- Provide education on infection prevention, vaccinations, and outbreak management.
- Deliver healthcare services, including assessments, diagnosis, treatment, and referrals in remote communities.
- Administer emergency care and provide health counseling, lifestyle guidance, and risk reduction.
- Ensure proper medication administration and manage immunization programs.
- Collect, maintain, and report health data to Sioux Lookout First Nations Health Authority (SLFNHA).
- Provide updates on community health status, program outcomes, and needs.
- Act as a liaison between community workers, healthcare professionals, and external resources.
- Train and mentor community-based workers.
- Advise on community wellbeing issues when requested.
- Support advocacy on social determinants of health and uphold ethical standards in care.
- Maintain patient confidentiality and provide culturally sensitive care in compliance with standards.
- Develop and implement emergency response plans and conduct drills for community readiness.

Position Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree in nursing (preferred) with registration in good standing with the Ontario College of Nurses; Master of Public Health (specialization in Nursing) is an asset.
- 2 years of experience as a Registered Nurse in public health, health promotion, disease prevention, and communicable disease control.



- Experience providing nursing care in rural or remote areas (asset).
- Knowledge of northern Ontario's health service delivery and inter-jurisdictional healthcare issues (asset).
- Current Basic Life Support (BLS) Certificate.
- Clear Background and Vulnerable Sector Check.
- Proof of immunizations or valid medical exemption.
- Ability to maintain confidentiality with sensitive information.
- Access to a vehicle, valid driver's license, and clear driving abstract.
- Ability to travel occasionally to IFNA communities via small aircraft or vehicle.
- Ability to work independently and within interdisciplinary teams.
- Flexibility to work in remote, resource-limited environments.
- Strong interpersonal, advocacy, and communication skills.
- Proficiency with virtual care technologies and electronic health record systems.
- Understanding of Indigenous culture and language (asset).

Note: Flexibility is key at IFNA. You may occasionally cover tasks outside your role, ensuring comprehensive support for our organization's mission.
